#### PERMIT REQUIRED

Per Ordinance 691, Sections 5-209-5-216 of the Osceola Municipal Code, Mobile Food Vendors operating within the City of Osceola are required to have a current Mobile Food Vendor Permit.

### SUMMARY OF MOBILE FOOD VENDOR REGULATIONS

## For exact language, see Osceola Municipal Code Section 5-109-5-216.

- engage in Mobile Food Vending in Osceola must apply for a Mobile Food Vendor Permit. Permits issued by the City are valid for one day only and shall be renewed each and every day the applicant desires to engage as a Mobile Food Vendor in Osceola.
- Mobile Food Vendors may only locate at one of the two designated parking stalls at the Food Truck Court on the south side of the City Park, on the date approved on the Mobile Food Vendor Permit Application.
- A maximum of 2 Mobile Food Vendors are allowed to operated at the Food Truck Court per day. A Mobile Food Vendor may operate at the Food Truck Court only one time per week.

- A Mobile Food Vendor shall not sell, offer to sell or provide food from City Park property, other than the designated Food Truck Court on the south side of the City Park.
- Mobile Food Vendors can serve between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m., seven days a week. The Osceola City Council, Polk Co. Sheriff or Polk Co. Emergency Management may limit those hours if necessary.
- Mobile Food vendors are permitted to one menu or identification sign and one table (not for sitting), which shall be directly adjacent to the unit. No other signage, tables or other obstructions are permitted.
- Mobile Food Vendors shall comply with all state laws including fire suppression equipment maintenance and all Osceola Ordinances, specifically those relating to noise.
- A representative shall be present with the Mobile Food Vending Unit at all times that it is parked and service is occurring.

- Mobile Food Vendors are prohibited from selling alcoholic beverages or alcoholic food items.
- provide trash receptacles in sizes sufficient to serve customers. Prior to leaving MFVs shall pick up and properly dispose of any trash or litter within 20 feet of location. MVF trash shall not be deposited in public trash containers on City property.
- Mobile Food Vendors shall provide their own generators as a power source.
- 12. If utilizing deep fat frying equipment, or any equipment that uses or produces grease, the Mobile Food Vendor must have a proper means of disposal of said grease.
